Adjournment Debate on Cestrian Court



On 9 November, I hosted an Adjournment Debate in the House of Commons about the issues residents have faced at Cestrian Court in Chester-le-Street. The County Durham Fire & Rescue Service found that the building was not up to the necessary fire safety regulations.

Whilst the works have now been undertaken, the cost of the works have been passed on to residents. I have called on the builders to step in to rectify this and also on the Government to ensure that leaseholders are not left to foot the bill to make buildings like this safe.

Thank you to all of the residents that contacted me to raise concerns about this issue.

Blue Plaque for Lord & Lady Lawson



On 23 October, I was delighted to attend the unveiling of a blue plaque for Baron Jack and Lady Bella Lawson of Beamish at their former home in Woodside, Beamish.

Jack was the MP for Chester-le-Street 1919-1949, and Bella was a suffragist, Labour activist, community volunteer and pioneer of child welfare clinics.

The unveiling of the plaque was organised by local historian Dorothy

Rand MBE and Jack and Bella were nominated for a blue plaque by the Women's Banner Group.

Health and Care Bill



Alongside my constituent Dawn Knight, I have long campaigned for the Government to introduce legislation to regulate cosmetic surgery.

Currently, no additional training or qualification is needed to undertake cosmetic procedures, and this has led to an increase in 'self-accredited' training courses.

As the Health and Care Bill passed through the Commons, I supported an amendment that would have required the licensing of cosmetic procedures. Unfortunately, the amendment was not accepted, but I hope that a similar amendment will be introduced as the Bill is considered by the House of Lords.

This is an issue that I will continue to campaign on until the law is changed.

As world leaders gathered in Glasgow to discuss how to tackle the climate emergency, I have been asking residents in North Durham where they feel additional charging points for Electric Vehicles should be installed.

As the sale of new petrol and diesel cars will come to an end in 2030 and of hybrid vehicles in 2035, it is important that we plan ahead.

Across Co Durham, we have a lot of terraced properties that do not have offstreet parking to enable electric vehicles to be charged so we are looking at where public charging points could be installed.
